

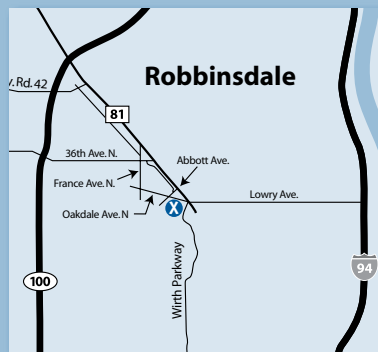

North Memorial Rehabilitation Services for Children

Navigating your way through the world of child rehabilitation services can seem perplexing and overwhelming. With various services offered by schools, community agencies and medical providers, it's hard to know where to get the best care for your child. At North Memorial, we'll help you sort through the confusion and help you to see – and realize – your child's potential.

We help children be all they can be by creating an individualized treatment plan, which is developed through a close working relationship between family members and care givers. Our services are provided by an interdisciplinary team of professionals that provides each child from birth to age 18 with a comprehensive evaluation of his or her development, including perceptual-motor skills, speech and language skills, feedings skills, cognition and motor control. Most of the services we provide require a physician's order.

As part of our services, we offer:

- Evaluation and treatment of children with special needs
- Inpatient and outpatient pediatric rehabilitation, including physical therapy, occupational therapy and speech pathology
- Family education
- Programs for home follow-through
- Videotaping to show progress and treatment recommendations
- Consultation with school and community agencies
- Referral to home care and other services as appropriate
- Adaptive equipment recommendations

Speech and Language Therapy

Our speech and language therapy services include:

- Speech pathologists specially trained in treating children
- Free speech and language screenings
- Evaluation and treatment of children with delayed speech and language skills. Cognitive palsy, cleft palate, autism, head injuries, apraxia, stuttering, voice disorders, auditory processing and issues related to prematurity
- Consultation with parents
- Evaluation and treatment of oral/motor and feeding/swallowing disorders; incorporation of standard programs such as Fast ForWord™ and The Listening Program®

Physical Therapy

Our physical therapy services include:

- Evaluating and treating children with a variety of diagnoses including delayed motor development, head injuries, cerebral palsy, torticollis
- Teaching movement skills, balance, equilibrium and control of movement
- Assessing need for orthoses, splints and other adaptive equipment
- Instructing children how to incorporate equipment into their lifestyles
- Developing home programs to facilitate development of age-appropriate gross motor skills

Occupational Therapy

Our occupational therapy services include:

- Use of standardized tests to assess motor planning and coordination skills, visual and perceptual skills, postural control, oral motor function and functional daily skill levels. Staff are also qualified to administer the Sensory Integration and Praxis Test (SIPT) to assess neurosensory processing function.
- Creation of or recommendation for therapeutic adaptations such as splints, inhibitory casting and assistive devices
- Incorporation of standard programs such as Handwriting Without Tears Program, Therapeutic Listening Program and Interactive Metronome Program as appropriate
- Teaching children how to use therapeutic adaptations
- Providing sensory integration therapy
- Designing written/home/school programs to assist with follow through away from the clinic site
